Join in the Walk of Awareness

The Walk of Awareness at Port Adelaide is a community event to commemorate the 7th Anniversary of the National Apology to Australia's Indigenous People.

On Friday 13 February at 11.30am the community will gather on the northern side of Birkenhead Bridge, and will walk across the southern side to Hart's Mill where a Kurna Welcome to Country, storytelling and a free community BBQ will take place.

The event commemorates the 7th Anniversary of the National Apology to Australia's Indigenous Peoples, which was delivered by former Prime Minister Kevin Rudd on February 13, 2008. The Apology gave particular acknowledgment to the Stolen Generations.

The Walk of Awareness is a great opportunity to walk along side members of the community and to honour the Indigenous peoples of this land, the oldest continuing cultures in human history.

The community event is a collaboration of several community organisations including: Xanadu Semaphore, Aboriginal Drug and Alcohol Council (SA) Inc., Kura Yerlo, Medicare Local Central Adelaide and Hills, Western Men's Group, Metropolitan Aboriginal Youth and Family Services (MAYFS) and Relationships Australia South Australia.
