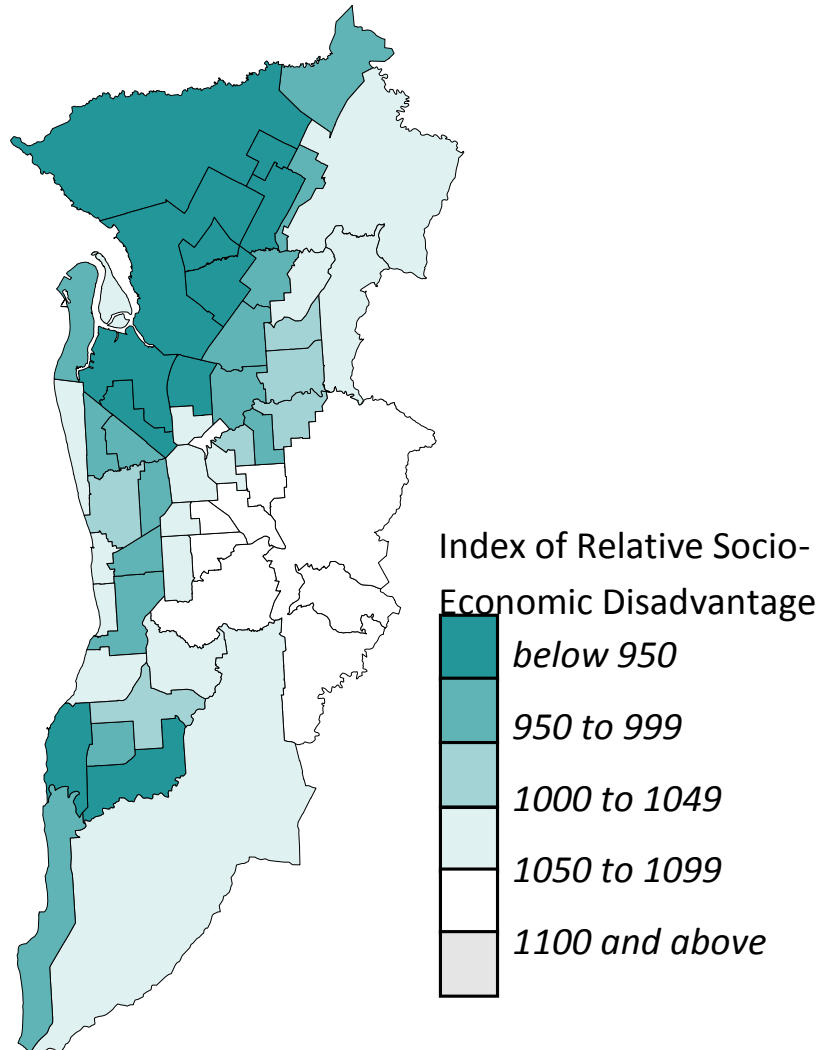
Background

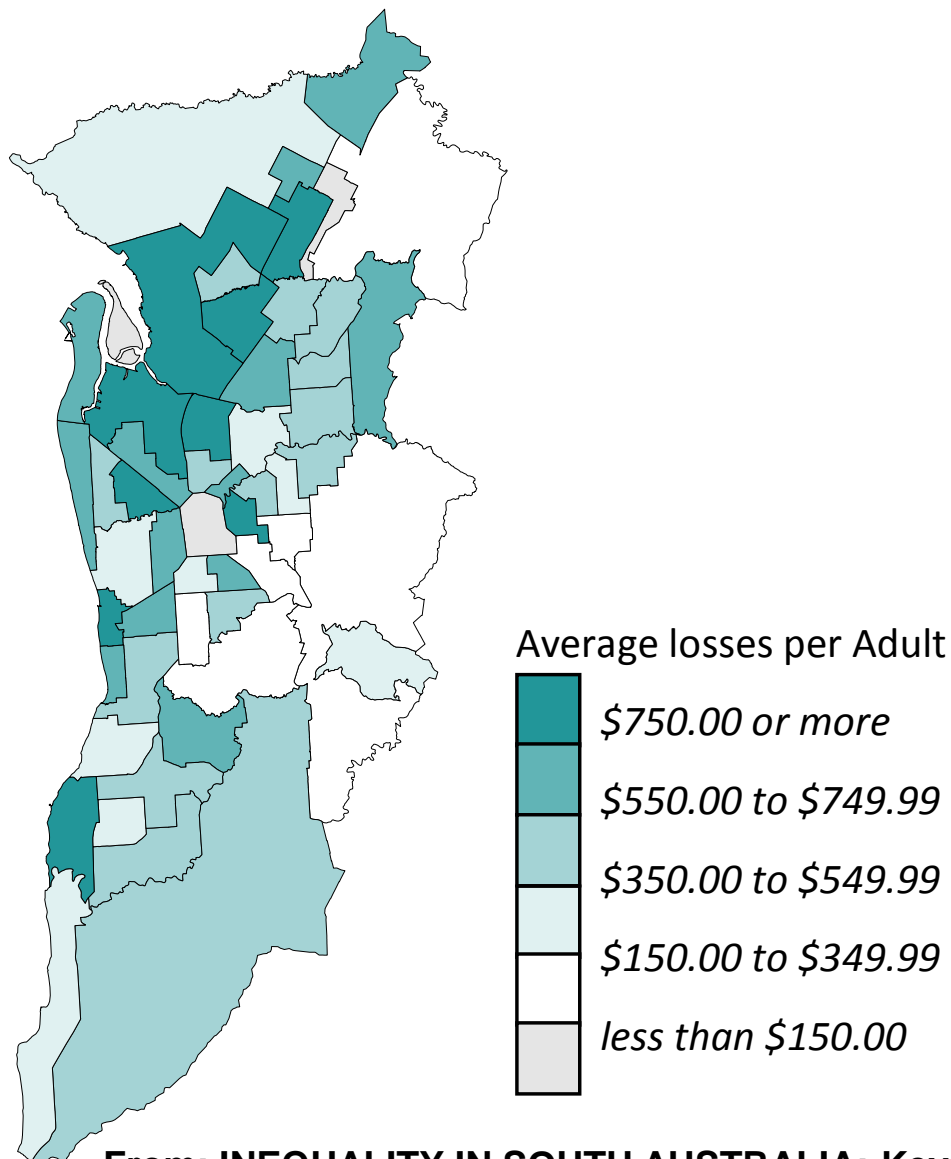
The data are presented at a geographic level that allows for comparison of outcomes at a community level.

(one of five Socio-economic Indexes for Areas)



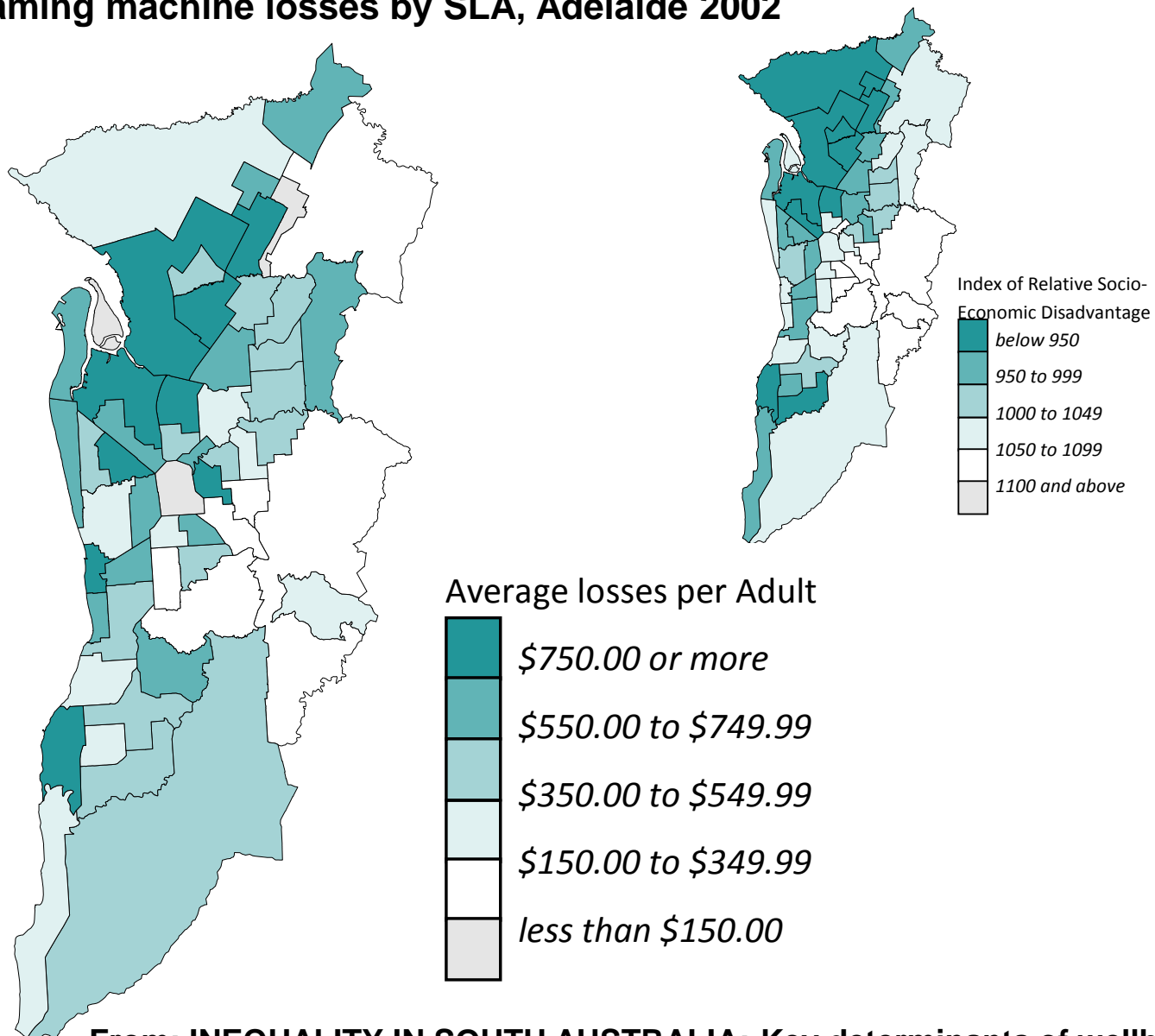
Electronic gaming machine losses by SLA, Adelaide 2002
