Counselling and support is available for:

- Anyone directly harmed by a crime
- Anyone harmed as a result of witnessing a crime

- Relatives of a person who has died or suffered harm as a result of a crime.

The therapeutic counselling we provide is to support people whilst they navigate the criminal justice process. The crime may be violent or non-violent and includes family and domestic violence and sexual assault.

This is a confidential and free service available state-wide. Counselling and support is delivered face to face, by telephone or online video appointment. We also provide phone counselling via TTY and in your preferred language.
